Use Videos to Supplement Face-to-Face Instruction – personalize learning and save time

Select a Flexible Learning Management System or learning platform –Homebase for students' work- assessment, discussion, notes, assignment, etc.

Use a consistent layout – in orderly arrangement



Create two-way communication – establish habits of feedback, discussion, and communication



Promote students' professionalism – communication ethics – language usedmeaningful conversation

VIRTUAL Learning

Distance learning conducted in a virtual learning environment with electronic study content designed for self-paced (asynchronous) or live web-conferencing (synchronous) online teaching and tutoring. (Racheva, 2017)

VIRTUAL Classroom

A virtual classroom is an online learning environment that allows for live interaction between the tutor and the learners as they are participating in learning activities. (Racheva, 2018)

How to assess? TRADITIONAL ASSESSMENT?? AUTHENTIC ASSESMENT?!

Positive and constructive feedback

Authentic Assessment

Multiple forms of assessment that reflect student's learning, achievement, motivation, and attitudes on instructionally-relevant classroom activities –representing real-life settings (O'Mally & Pierce, 1996)

'authentic' in the sense that they are personally meaningful and can be activated throughout a lifetime of learning and living in the wider community (Kohonen, 2001, 2012).






Tools for Scoring



Checklists, rating scales and rubrics are tools that state specific criteria and allow teachers and students to gather information and to make judgements about what students know and can do in relation to the outcomes. They offer systematic ways of collecting data about specific behaviours, knowledge and skills. (Alberta Education, 2008)



a yes/no format in relation to student demonstration of specific criteria. CHECKLIST the degree or frequency of the behaviours, skills and strategies displayed by the learner. **RATING SCALE**



a set of criteria to evaluate a student's performance, consisting of a fixed measurement scale and detailed description of the characteristics for each level of performance **RUBRIC**

Maintaining Transparent Authentic Assessment in Virtual Classroom

- Authentic assessments should always align with the course's learning objective(s).
- The instrument used to measure is based on the assessments/assignments designed for the students, e.g. observation sheet, checklist, rating scale, or scoring rubrics.
- it is clear to students how they will be assessed and based on what criteria. the manner in which assignments need to be submitted, deadlines, the assessment procedure and how the final mark will be calculated.
- Transparency also includes accessibility to example questions and clarifying the appraisal criteria by making appraisal forms and rubrics available.

Maintaining Transparent Authentic Assessment in Virtual Classroom cont.

- Self and Peer assessments should be optimized, beside teacher's assessment. Instruct learners to self- and peer-assess their work, and encourage them to debug them, i.e. point out any ambiguities or inconsistencies.
- Grading is accessible to the student personally.
- Feedback and discussion about the students' works are a must.

Dr. Chand Kiran Saluja

President, Rashtriya Sanskrit Promotion Foundation (Inaugural Speaker) Eminent Sanskrit scholar Dr. **Chand Kiran Saluja** has been selected for this year's prestigious 'President's Certificate of Honour' by the Government of India. Dr. Saluja has dedicated his entire life for promotion of Sanskrit language, particularly to change the way Sanskrit is taught in the country.

Dr Saluja taught Sanskrit, Hindi, Philosophy of Educatio in Central Institute of Education, University of Delhi for more than twenty years before he took VRS and joined the Sanskrit Promotion Foundation as Director, Academics. He is considered to be a great authority in subjects like Human Rights & Education with special reference to Children's Rights, Philosophy, Sociology and Problems of Indian Education, Legal Perspectives of Education, Ancient or Bharatiya System of Education.


Dr Saluja is actively working in promotion of Sanskrit across the world through his project Sanskrit Promotion Foundation (SPF) under ONGC- CSR. He has already produced more than 70 books in Sanskrit. Apart from this, Dr. Saluja is engaged in online Sanskrit tutorials, translation of books and research in Sanskrit pedagogy.



Prof. R.P.Singh (Center For Philosophy, JNU)

Dr. R.P. Singh is a professor of Philosophy in Centre for Philosophy JNU, New Delhi .His specialisation area is in German Idealism, Postmodernity, Consciousness: Indian and Western Perspectives, Studies in Ethics, Civilization and Culture Studies, Upanishads, Vedanta, Buddhism, Human Right, Multiculturalism, Globalization, Philosophy of Education, etc. He did work in Dialectics, scepticism, foundationalism/antifoundationalism, hermeneutics- Indian and Western deconstruction theories.

He has a teaching experience of 31 Years. He had received Man of the Year 2001 & 2004, by AmericanBiographicalInstitute, USA, Marquis Who's Who in the World 2009 for valuable contribution in the field of education. He was one of the 100 Outstanding Intellectuals of 21st Century awarded by International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, University, London, UK in 2010 edition. He has also received International Plato Award by International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, University, London, UK in 2011.




Prof. Bal Ram Singh (Institute of Advanced Sciences, Dartmouth, Massachusett, USA)

Dr. Bal Ram Singh has been a professor since1990 and Henry Dreyfus Teacher-scholar since 1997 at UMass Dartmouth (until 2014) and at the Institute of Advanced Sciences (INADS), Dartmouth, Massachusetts. He has been a visiting professor at Georgetown University, Harvard Medical School, Yang Ming University (Taiwan), and Jawaharlal Nehru University (India). He is currently the President of the Institute of Advanced Sciences, and also the founder of Prime Bio Inc., a biotechnology-based company.

Dr. Singh is the Founding Director of the Botulinum Research Center, established in 2003 and currently located at INADS. He is also the Founding Director of the Center for Indic Studies at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. He is currently a Fellow of the Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Advanced Study, JNU, Delhi. Dr. Singh is an alumnus of Kamla Nehru Institute Science and Technology of Avadh University, Ayodhya, India, Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi, India and TexasTech University in Lubbock, TX, USA. He has published 13 books and over 300 articles, including articles related to India's philosophy and traditions.

He is Editor/Associate Editor of four journals, including Biochemical and Biophysical Research Reports (Elsevier), Ayurveda Journal of Health (UMass Dartmouth), and International Journal of Indian Culture and Business Management. Ayurveda - Health Happiness and Harmony Book Series, Motilal Banarsidass.



Prof. Jeffrey D. Long (Religion and Asian Studies at Elizabethtown College, U.S.A)

Prof. Jeffrey D Long is Professor of Religion and Asian Studies at Elizabethtown College, in Pennsylvania, USA.

He is associated with the Vedanta Society, DĀNAM and the Hindu American Foundation. A major theme of Long's work is religious pluralism, a topic he approaches from a perspective informed by the process philosophy of Alfred North Whitehead and which he refers to as a "Hindu process theology". He has written books on Jainism and Hinduism.
