She joins student movement when she was in college. She graduated from Yonsei University and received her B.A. (Bachelor of Arts) in Literature.

Gong works mostly focus on issues surrounding laborers, underprivileged and discrimination. She has also written about the lives of young educated women attempting to fight for her lives within and without the family.

Gong is a feminist writer. In many of her works, she uses a lot of topic about women's struggle and labor movement in characters that must face the twin task of building a new identity after the labor movement and finding a place a maledominated society. Anger and confusion becomes the main subject of Gong's works.

Social activism is one of Gong's main concerns, equality for women, particularly in patriarchal way of thinking. Gong continues to explore about gender equality. In 1993, her novel *Go Alone Like the Horn of a Rhinoceros*, which deals directly with women's issues, has made into a movie, *Go Alone Like a Rhino Horn* which is also Gong's first work that made into a feature film.
