Editor and reviewer comments:

Reviewer #1:

- 1. Clarity and Specificity: The abstract provides a clear overview of the study's objectives, methods, and findings. However, it would be beneficial to specify the linguistic aspects explored in the research to give readers a more detailed understanding.
- 2. Elaboration on Data Sources: While the use of qualitative data from books, journals, and offline articles is mentioned, it would enhance the credibility of the study to provide examples or specific sources. This will help readers gauge the reliability of the information.
- 3. Temporal Scope: The time frame of the study is mentioned (September 2021 to January 2022), but a brief explanation of why this period was chosen could add depth to the methodology section.
- 4. Connection between Politeness and Acceptability: The abstract hints at a connection between translators' language politeness and the acceptability of translations. Adding a sentence or two to elucidate this connection would strengthen the argument.
- 5. Quantification of Results: The abstract mentions that higher understanding and mastery of linguistic aspects lead to better translations. It would be valuable to quantify this improvement, either through statistical data or specific examples from the research.
- Incorporating a Case Study or Examples: Integrating a brief case study or examples of translations, where linguistic aspects and politeness significantly impacted acceptability, could provide a practical dimension to the study.
- 7. Implications for Translation Practice: It would be helpful to include a section in the abstract that briefly discusses how the findings of this study could be applied in practical translation scenarios. What advice or guidelines can be drawn for translators?
- Addressing Potential Limitations: A sentence acknowledging potential limitations of the study, such as any
 constraints in data collection or the generalizability of results, would contribute to a more comprehensive
 understanding.

- 9. Linking Keywords with Findings: The abstract could establish a stronger link between the keywords (Translation, language politeness, language aspects, rejection, source language) and the actual findings of the study to make it more cohesive.
- 10. Highlighting Original Contribution: While the importance of politeness and linguistic aspects is discussed, it would be beneficial to explicitly state the novel contribution of this study to the existing body of knowledge in translation studies. What sets this research apart?

We hope you can make improvements as soon as possible and send the revised article again via this email.
